


Message from Father Mike...

In this weekend's Gospel, we have the beautiful version of the Beatitudes. They are a kinder and gentler version of the 10 Commandments. Each one of them speaks to the heart. It takes a humble heart to not only read the Beatitudes but to put them into action.

Humility is a gift, and there was no one who practiced humility better than Saint Theresa of Calcutta. There are many stories of her gift of humility throughout her life. When she first began her ministry to the poor in the streets of Calcutta, the first person that she ministered to was a dying Hindu man in the streets. She could do little for him other than to hold him as he died. It was a very humble act on her part. She was often known to give up her first class seat on an aircraft and give it to someone else. She cared more about others than she did for herself.

I challenge you this week to use those wonderful cell phones of yours and look up the Beatitudes. Read them once or twice this week and see how you can put them into action. I often joke about being someone who loves a big old piece of pie. Maybe this week a bigger piece of humble pie.
