This year due to COVID restrictions, ashes will not be placed on the forehead. Instead, a small amount will be sprinkled on the crown of the head. Just a Reminder:



Ash Wednesday is a day of fast and abstinence. Everyone ages 18-59 should fast by eating only one full meal, and everyone ages 14 and older must abstain from eating meat. Every Friday during Lent is a day of abstinence from eating meat.

#### A MESSAGE FROM FATHER MIKE:

This Wednesday February 17th, is Ash Wednesday, the beginning of the Lenten season. What a year this has been for all of us! I'm taking back to my childhood days when we would give up something for Lent. My biggest struggle was ice cream. This Lenten season I'm going to ask you to focus

on doing something rather than not doing something. Because of the pandemic I know that many of you have been unable to come to church. It certainly is understandable. Beginning Ash Wednesday every service in every church will be available online. You simply go to the website, click on the link, and you can go to Daily Mass, Stations of the Cross, Exposition of Blessed Sacrament, and of course, our regular weekend masses. This will be an opportunity for you in your own very quiet way to do something extra during the Lenten season. In addition to these videos, we will have extra opportunity for the Sacrament of Reconciliation. In this weekend's Gospel, a leper is cured of his leprosy. He walked away rejoicing after he was cured. It is my hope that we come to the end of the Lenten season rejoicing for the healing that has occurred in all of us.



## A VIEW FROM THE PEW, "TESHUVA".

Teshuva is a Hebrew word often associated with repentance, but it is more accurately understood as turning back to God and to obey Him - a good word to describe our Lenten journey which begins on Ash Wednesday. To turn back we must first stop and realize we are going in the wrong direction. Often, this is not easy; just ask any guy who is lost on some highway but ignores his wife urging him to stop and ask for directions! Pride and arrogance always seem to get in the way, even when it comes to our faith. Now would be a good time to

to assess the direction we are headed and maybe stop and take these few words to heart. "Repent and believe in the Gospel."

- 3. The pastor will go over with the bride and groom the regulations of the church pertaining to the upcoming wedding.
