
On February 22nd, the Second Grade Students will receive First Reconciliation at noon.

Recently I went into our wonderful Confirmation classes and asked about the 10 Commandments and was surprised to know that we have 10 of them because of our 10 fingers - one for each commandment. This weekend's Gospel has Jesus talking about the Commandments and how some folks followed them to the "letter" of the Law. Following the

Commandments with our brain and not our hearts is wrong! Jesus is trying to tell folks that we are not considered good folks because we follow, for example, "you shall not kill." Not killing is good, being Pro-Life is even better. "You shall not steal" is good, giving to the poor is better. "You shall not commit adultery" is good, promoting chastity is better. I think you get it. Now do it - or not!

A VIEW FROM THE PEW, CHYRSOSTOMOS



Born in 349, Saint John Chrysostom was a bishop and is a Doctor of the Church. After death he was given the name CHRYSOSTOMOS, Greek for "golden mouthed". The name was appropriate because of his oratory skills and ability to apply scripture to everyday circumstances. I found a few quotes that are appropriate even today.

- "No matter how just your words may be, when you speak with anger, you ruin all..." Good advice for family and political conversations!
- "Let us always guard our tongue; not that it should always be silent, but that it should speak at the proper time." Really good advice for meetings!
- Finally, "When you are weary of praying, and do not receive, consider how often you heard a poor man calling, and have not listened to him." Something to contemplate for lent.
