If you've been to church or watched Mass on You Tube, you have seen two purple banners in the altar area. The first word on the banner is REPENT. During the season of Lent this word is of utmost importance. Repentance has two components: sorrow and change. When we celebrate the Sacrament of Penance we

say we are sorry for those things we have done wrong. When we walk out of the confessional we are challenged to change. Most of us get the "sorrow" part, the "change" part is often difficult. During this season of Lent, I urge you to focus on the word REPENT. Say you're sorry and change!

Teshuva is a Hebrew word often associated with repentance, but it is more accurately understood as turning back to God and to obey Him - a good word to describe our Lenten journey which begins on Ash Wednesday. To turn back we must first stop and realize we are going in the wrong direction. Often, this is not easy; just ask any guy who is lost on some highway but ignores his wife urging him to stop and ask for directions! Pride and arrogance always seem to get in the way, even when it comes to our faith. Now would be a good time to

to assess the direction we are headed and maybe stop and take these few words to heart. "Repent and believe in the Gospel."
