Ash Wednesday is a day of fast and abstinence. Everyone ages 18-59 should fast by eating only one full meal, and everyone ages 14 and older must abstain from eating meat. Every Friday during Lent is a day of abstinence from eating meat.



STATIONS OF THE CROSS will be offered at Immaculate Conception Parish every Friday during Lent at noon and again at 7:00 PM beginning this Friday, February 28th. The evening Stations will include Exposition of the Blessed Sacrament and Benediction from 6:00 to 6:55 PM. Stations of the Cross will be offered at Good Shepherd Parish every Friday at 4:00 PM with Exposition of the Blessed Sacrament from 3:00 - 3:45 PM and Benediction at 3:45 PM.
