Temptation....Transfiguration....Anger.... See The Light. These words mark our journey through the Lenten Season. In this weekend's Gospel Jesus has an encounter with Nicodemus. Nick (for short) was a member of the Sanhedrin, a ruling body for the Jews. He was probably a secret admirer of Jesus – He liked the miracles, but was not fully convinced he was the Messiah. The conversation was Jesus' attempt to get Nick to see the light.

Our Lenten theme is: How will you be Transformed – Darkness to Light? Like Nick in today's Gospel, Jesus is calling you to see the Light! One of the best ways to see the Light is to celebrate the Sacrament of Reconciliation – the Light will be on for you!

It is also the policy of the Diocese to adhere to all civil and state regulations. In accordance with the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania's Child Protective Services Laws, reports of suspected child abuse should also be made immediately by phone to the 24-Hour Child Abuse hotline (ChildLine) at 1-800-932-0313 or electronically at [www.compass.state.pa.us/cwis](http://www.compass.state.pa.us/cwis). To this end, the Diocese is equally committed to adhering to the norms of the Code of Canon Law and to upholding the tenets of the USCCB Charter for the Protection of Children and Young People, which includes supporting victims of sexual abuse in their pursuit of emotional and spiritual well-being. As such, information regarding an allegation of sexual abuse of a minor should also be reported to the Victim Assistance Coordinator Mary Beth Pacuska at 570-862-7551.
