
FAITH FORMATION NEWS: Reminder: No class March 29th. Classes resume April 5th.

Bishop Schlert (Bishop of Allentown) in his Lenten Pastoral Letter for 2020 had an interesting take on the Stations of the Cross and anger. In each station the reflection deals with anger which is overflowing in almost every

aspect of our lives in this country. Rather than list them all, I thought the Tenth Station was appropriate, especially for our younger parishioners. The Tenth Station: Jesus is Stripped of His Clothes - "In my anger, do I strip someone of his or her dignity or good name by what I say about them, what I post on social media, or how I act toward them?" Social Media is such an easy way to reach many people, but once your words are out there, they're out there! Maybe a fast on anger isn't such a bad idea!

If parishioners are sick or suspect they are sick with a contagious illness, they are not bound by the Sunday Mass obligation.


