"I hear voices." If someone says that today, they might be looked at a little strangely. In this weekend's Gospel, the people heard what some said was thunder and others said was an angel. They definitely heard something. I challenge each of us this week to LISTEN with our eyes. There is no doubt that God speaks to us. I think many look for words they can actually hear.

But God doesn't always use the words we expect. HE speaks to us also in nature and in signs. A rainbow is a perfect example. We see it and might recognize its beauty, but do we HEAR God in the rainbow. My mother used to pray novenas to St. Theresa. A sign that her novena was answered was when she saw a rose. It could be either handed to her or she might see it on TV. Her prayers were answered. LOOK for God and LISTEN, HE has something to say to YOU!

I read an interesting article about Lenten symbols from the Archdiocese of Saint Paul and Minneapolis called Rediscover. The article listed the obvious, but here are a few I found interesting. **FISH**, this symbol is an obvious one which we are familiar with; the Lenten symbol of fasting on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday and no meat on Fridays. The symbol of a fish was also used

as a means of identification during the Roman persecution. The fish was also used in pagan religions, so it did not cause suspicion among the Roman authorities. One would draw half of the fish when people would meet and if the other person completed the fish they knew they were Christians. MONEY BAGS symbolize the Lenten penitential practice of almsgiving. "Prayer and fasting are good, but better than either is almsgiving accompanied by righteousness. It is better to give alms than to store up gold, for almsgiving saves one from death and expiates every sin. Those who give alms shall enjoy a full life." (Tob 12:8,9)

PRETZELS had their origin in early Christian Lenten practice. Fat, eggs and milk were forbidden during Lent so a special dough was made with just flour, salt, and water. The little breads were shaped in the form of arms crossed in prayer and were called "bracellae" (Latin, 'little arms'). Among the Germans the Latin word became 'bretzel'. This was a common Lenten food in the Middle Ages in Europe and didn't become a year-round snack, the pretzel, until the 19th Century. Stones, bread, fish and pretzels are just a few things to contemplate on our journey through Lent as we soften our hearts!
