


**OUR SANCTUARY CANDLE** is burning this week in Memory of Joseph Baran by His Mother and Brothers

From the Pastor's Desk Blindness in Jesus' day was a sign of sinfulness. It was seen as a punishment from God. If a child was born blind then it was a punishment from God for the sins of the parents (fortunately we know better today). As in last week's Gospel with the woman at the well, there is true faith

lacking here. After the person's sight is restored, folks STILL want proof - let's ask the parents. The surface proof was restored sight. The REAL proof was Jesus, and they were BLIND to seeing who Jesus really was. Here's a challenge this week: Look for Jesus where you least expect to find Him.



## A VIEW FROM THE PEW, FASTING ON ANGER.

Bishop Schlert (Bishop of Allentown) in his Lenten Pastoral Letter for 2020 had an interesting take on the Stations of the Cross and anger. In each station the reflection deals with anger which is overflowing in almost every aspect of our lives in this country. Rather than list them

all, I thought the Tenth Station was appropriate, especially for our younger parishioners. The Tenth Station: Jesus is Stripped of His Clothes - "In my anger, do I strip someone of his or her dignity or good name by what I say about them, what I post on social media, or how I act toward them?" Social Media is such an easy way to reach many people, but once your words are out there, they're out there! Maybe a fast on anger isn't such a bad idea!
