BAPTISM PREPARATION CLASS will be held with Deacon Jim four times each year, in April, June, September, and December. <u>CHOOSE TO SERVE,</u> <u>CAN YOU SEE YOURSELF AS AN ALTAR SERVER!</u>

"To serve at the altar, as to sing in the choir, is next to the priesthood the highest privilege which a human can enjoy." Archbishop of Westminster Bernard Cardinal Griffen. Since the second century, altar servers have always had a place in the Eucharistic Celebration. Think about it, there have always been people who assisted at table and put things back in order afterwards. Ideally, servers are fully initiated Catholics. Altar Servers must have received the Sacraments of Baptism and First Holy Communion; however, youths who have not been confirmed may serve as well. The minimum age and scheduling procedures are left to the pastor's discretion. Responsibilities: carry the cross, processional candles and the incense and censor, present the bread, wine and water to the priest during the preparation of gifts and assist the priest as necessary. The role of the server is an integral part of the celebration of the Mass. At least one server should assist the priest, two or more for Sundays, funerals and important holydays. This important ministry is also open to adults as well. Why not CHOOSE TO SERVE. Altar Servers are in short supply for funerals and non-existent at daily Mass. Remember, as a server, you stand near the altar on which bread and wine become Jesus Christ! Why not make a commitment this Lent to consider the ministry of an Altar Server!
