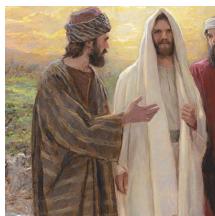
Signed copies of Father McHugh's poetry book, **Kaleidoscope of the Heart**, will be available for purchase in the church office for \$20.00 during normal business hours.

As going to church each Sunday was ritual, so was sitting in front of the black & white TV on Saturday mornings watching the newest cartoons. Beginning in 1963 Casper The Friendly Ghost entertained us for hours. Who would have thought a ghost that was non-scary and friendly?

In this weekend's Gospel the disciples thought they were seeing a ghost when Jesus appeared to them after the Resurrection. They were terrified. Jesus immediately said to them: "*Peace be with you.*" Those words of comfort calmed the fear of the disciples (remember, one betrayed Jesus, one denied him and the others took off). It was an emotional time for the disciples, but it all came together. Jesus explained why he had to go through the Passion that led to the Resurrection. He opened their minds to understand of Scripture. He finally challenged them to spread the Good News. I long for those Saturday mornings watching a ghost on TV, but I am much more in tune with the Jesus I see every day.

If any priest, deacon, religious, lay employee or volunteer of the Diocese of Scranton has cause or reason to suspect that a minor has been subjected to any form of abuse, including child sexual abuse, the matter will be reported to law enforcement. It is also the policy of the Diocese to adhere to all civil and state regulations. In accordance with the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania's Child Protective Services Laws, reports of suspected child abuse should also be made immediately by phone to the 24-Hour Child Abuse hotline (ChildLine) at 1-800-932-0313 or electronically at www.compass.state.pa.us/cwis. To this end, the Diocese is equally committed to adhering to the norms of the Code of Canon Law and to upholding the tenets of the USCCB Charter for the Protection of Children and Young People, which includes supporting victims of sexual abuse in their pursuit of emotional and spiritual well-being. As such, information regarding an allegation of sexual abuse of a minor should also be reported to the Victim Assistance Coordinator Mary Beth Pacuska at 570-862-7551.
