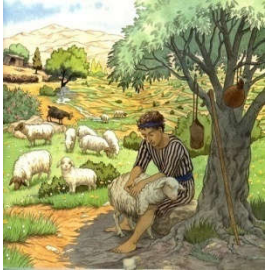
CANDLES ON THE ALTAR are in Memory of James Breznitsky by His Wife Frances and Sons

and owned about 50 sheep. Retreatants were welcome to help on the farm if they wished. Although I knew nothing about sheep, I asked to help. The morning project was to trim the horns of a couple of sheep. One had maggots growing between the horn and the scalp and we removed the horn and treated the poor sheep. What an experience!

I learned a lot about being a pastor on that retreat: Sheep need care. You have to GO to the sheep. Sheep often bleat when in trouble. Sheep smell. Our Holy Father, Pope Francis, challenges priests to not only know the sound of a sheep in trouble, but know the smell of the sheep. I am honored and humbled to be your pastor. PARISH DIRECTORY: The deadline for parishioners to register to be included in the joint parish directory is **April 28, 2024**. Registration forms are available in our church entrances and can be returned in the collection baskets or at either church office.

It is the policy of the Diocese of Scranton to report any allegation of sexual abuse of a minor to law enforcement. If you are a victim of sexual abuse committed by a priest, deacon, religious or lay employee or volunteer of the Diocese of Scranton, you are encouraged to immediately report the matter to law enforcement. If any priest, deacon, religious, lay employee or volunteer of the Diocese of Scranton has cause or reason to suspect that a minor has been subjected to any form of abuse, including child sexual abuse, the matter will be reported to law enforcement. It is also the policy of the Diocese to adhere to all civil and state regulations. In accordance with the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania's Child Protective Services Laws, reports of suspected child abuse should also be made immediately by phone to the 24-Hour Child Abuse hotline (ChildLine) at 1-800-932-0313 or electronically at www.compass.state.pa.us/cwis. To this end, the Diocese is equally committed to adhering to the norms of the Code of Canon Law and to upholding the tenets of the USCCB Charter for the Protection of Children and Young People, which includes supporting victims of sexual abuse in their pursuit of emotional and spiritual well-being. As such, information regarding an allegation of sexual abuse of a minor should also be reported to the Victim Assistance Coordinator Mary Beth Pacuska at 570-862-7551.
