#### A Message from Father Mike...



His name was Ralph. Like so many Vietnam vets, he was dealing with demons from the past. In Ralph's case, the demon was himself. He and his best friend were drafted shortly after high school graduation in 1968. They were lucky enough to go through basics and were stationed together. It was the TET Offensive where over 3,000 American soldiers were killed. Ralph's best friend was one of

them. He had jumped on a grenade and saved several men in his platoon. Ralph lived with the fact that his friend sacrificed himself so others could be saved. We sat together as I read to Ralph this weekend's Gospel. When the words "...no one has greater love than this, to lay down one's life for one's friend," Ralph began to cry. He put to rest his demon. Jesus laid down His life for you. Go and love others.

The Bishop, in accordance with CDC guidelines, has issued these policies that will be in effect starting this Monday, May 10th, at all weekday and weekend masses. Some items have not changed.

- Masks must continue to be worn covering your nose and mouth throughout the entire time you are in the church.
- > Social distancing must continue to be maintained.
- > Hand sanitizers and church sanitization must continue.

The following changes will be implemented:

- Communion will return to its regular place in the mass rather than at the conclusion.
- A non-contact exchange, such as a wave or nod may be given at the sign of peace.

You will be able to enter and exit the church using any door. Again, these changes start this Monday.
