This weekend we celebrate the Feast of the Holy Trinity - One God, Three persons. Most of us remember being told that the Trinity is a mystery. I never liked that answer. I wanted an explanation! As I have grown older I understand better the wisdom of the "mystery" answer. Proof is something for the mathematicians and scientists.

What makes our faith so special is that we believe what we do not see and we do not understand. It's called BELIEF! We cannot prove God exists and we cannot fully understand the Trinity. I'm comfortable with the word "mystery." Are you?

A VIEW FROM THE PEW, MYSTICAL ROSE



The Litany of Mary is a powerful prayer written in the Middle Ages. In it are many names attributed to Mary, one is the "Mystical Rose." Laura Hensley of EpicPew explains "Mary has shown us that the rose is Her favorite flower, through the mysterious roses that Juan Diego picked before giving him Her

image on his tilma (cloak)." St. Juan Diego was born in 1474 a native to Mexico. He became the first Roman Catholic indigenous saint from the Americas. Juan and his wife converted to Catholicism and were among the first to be baptized in the region. Juan was known for his devotion to the Blessed Mother, and while on his way to church, she appeared to him requesting that he ask the bishop to build a chapel in her honor. Juan approached the bishop, but he doubted his story. Mary appeared a second time and again he confronted the bishop, this time the bishop requested proof. The Virgin Mary appeared a third time, Juan explained what transpired and the Blessed Mother told him she would provide proof the next day. Unfortunately, Juan's sick uncle required care and he missed the meeting with Mary. Embarrassed, but needing a priest for his uncle, he set out and did not want to face Mary. Mary was persistent and found Juan anyway. Juan explained the situation and Mary asked him "am I not here, I who am your mother?" She cured his uncle and provided proof of the apparition. Mary asked him to climb a hill and collect flowers growing there. He obeyed and found many flowers blooming in December on the rocky land. He collected them in his cloak and presented them to the Blessed Mother who arranged the flowers within the cloak and told him to present it to the bishop. The bishop opened it and found a miraculous imprinted image of the Virgin Mary on the inside of the flower-filled cloak. This cloak from 1531 remains perfectly preserved at the "Basilica of Guadalupe" and has become one, of the most visited Catholic shrines. Mary, The Mystical Rose!

MISSIONARY SOCIETY OF ST. PAUL MISSION APPEAL IMMACULATE CONCEPTION JUNE 2/3

Our church is missionary by nature. Each of us as baptized Catholics are called to share in the work of evangelization. The diocese of Scranton collaborates with mission groups every year to raise funds for their missions through a program called the Missionary Cooperative Plan. The group assigned to our parish this year is the Missionary Society of St. Paul. Fr. Joseph Ibiwoye, MSP will be speaking to us from the Missionary Society of St Paul on the weekend of June 2^{nd} and 3^{rd} . There will be a second collection to support them in their work.

The Missionary Society of St. Paul (MSP) is a congregation of priests founded in Nigeria in 1977. The Society now has 260 priests. They are working in ten countries of Africa, (South Africa, Malawi, Botswana, Cameroon, Liberia, Chad, The Gambia, Nigeria, Kenya and Southern Sudan), Grenada in the West Indies, the United States, England, Sweden and Ireland. They also have about 127 seminarians in their seminary in Nigeria.

Their mission in Malawi provides rehabilitation and support for over 300 orphans who lost their parents due to AIDS. They need our financial assistance to continue this mission. They also need funds to: 1) provide fresh water wells, and education in rural communities of Chad, Malawi, South Sudan, Kenya and Nigeria; 2) sponsor seminarians, our future priests; 3) support priests in the founding/building of new churches. Your support to this worthy cause will be an immense encouragement to the Missionary Society of St. Paul to as they continue to take the good news to those desperately in need of it.
