RESERVATION

JUST A REMINDER: Reservations to attend mass are **REQUIRED**. Just call the parish office at **570-636-3035** on **Tuesday evenings from 5:30 - 7:00 PM**. Please remember that you can only enter the church through the ramp door and you must sit on the blue tape in the pews. Family members may sit together. You must wear a mask during the entire mass. Communion will be distributed at the end of the mass. At Communion you should pull your mask down, take the Eucharist, consume it, and then return your mask and immediately exit the church through the side door by the organ. You should not congregate outside the church after mass. There will be no bulletins in the church. You must continue to view the bulletin online.

UPDATES ON FIRST COMMUNION AND CONFIRMATION

FIRST HOLY COMMUNION will be celebrated on Saturday, June 13th, at 10:00 AM and at 12:00 PM.



CONFIRMATION will be celebrated on Tuesday, June 23rd, at 7:00 PM in Immaculate Conception Parish. Only the Confirmation student, his/her parents, and sponsor will be allowed to be present for the Sacrament. The mass, however, will be live streamed on the usual mass link.
