#### A Message from Father Mike...



I remember as a child the movie "Follow Me Boys." It starred Fred McMurray as a musician who comes to the town of Hickory and eventually becomes a Boy Scout leader. He takes a rag-tag group of boys and helps them become better persons through the Scouting program. The year was 1966 and as a 9 year-old Boy Scout, it had a tremendous impact on me.

You can see how the story easily translates into this weekend's Gospel. Jesus is the leader and we are all encouraged to follow Him. There will be sacrifices along the way, but if we keep our eyes on the goal, we will achieve salvation. Jesus wants us to become better persons. We just need to follow Him and His ways.

I often tell folks I would not be the man I am today without the Scouting program (I still go to Scout camp every Sunday during the summer months to celebrate Mass). I would hope that all of us become better Catholics because we follow Jesus.

Parking Lot Masses: All weekend Masses at Good Shepherd Church are available over your car radio. We ask that you park in the lower lot and tune your car radio to FM 98.3. You will be able to listen to the Mass over your radio in the comfort of your car and remain socially distant. At the end of Mass, an Extraordinary Minister will come to the parking lot to distribute Holy Communion. If you bring your envelopes, those will also be collected.
