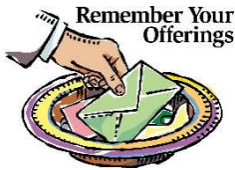

Eileen. I'm also feeling a little guilty now. I want to visit her. These are my feelings. I cannot begin to imagine what my sister is feeling and going through. On a daily basis she carries her cross, albeit a walker. She is confined to her facility and has not has a chance to go shopping - she loves shopping. She suffered a traumatic brain injury from a simple fall, but she got up and is surviving and thriving. We've all had our crosses to carry and been asked to sacrifice. Eileen, you are my hero!
