I remember my first Mission trip to Ecuador. We had a great bunch of students who were into "mission." We worked well together. We were responsible for our own cooking - believe me, there was no Wal-Mart down the road. We worked in hospitals and nursing homes and visited very poor families. At

the end of the trip, we took one afternoon to do a little shopping for small gifts to take home. Things changed that day. The students went overboard in buying trinkets. I can remember one girl who pointed to these very nice native style dresses and took five of them. It turns out that the kids had hundreds of dollars to spend. Let me tell you, things really did change that day. The advisors made a decision that on further mission trips each student would be allowed only a small amount of money to spend on gifts. We also made the decision, that once we reached a mission site, all money be put away and we would walk with "no money in our bags." We learned that our greatest gift to those we met was the gift of presence, just being there with them. So, maybe the lesson is this: less stuff, more of yourself!



A VIEW FROM THE PEW, MAYBE IT'S TIME TO LISTEN.

Thomas Craughwell of the National Catholic Register reviewed a book "How the Church Influenced (and still can) Western Civilization" authored by William Slattery. In his review he mentioned the exploits of Saint Boniface (c.680-754). He was a missionary who brought the

Catholic faith and culture to then barbarian Germany. He did something missionaries rarely did in the Dark Ages, <u>listen</u>. He would sit down with pagan priests and give them the opportunity to explain what they believed and why, then and only after they finished, he would point out the faults of their arguments and explain the beauty and truth of the Catholic faith. The simple act of listening can diffuse a tense situation, convert a doubter or just result in a more pleasant discussion of a problem. All of us can do a better job of listening. It worked for St. Boniface, why not give it a try!
