sentenced to 12 to 23 months in county. While in prison, she got clean and turned her life around. After her release there was a new hunger in Bev's life. This time the hunger was not for alcohol, but to simply do good for others. Her problem came when she went back to her hometown. She wanted to make amends for the wrong she had done in the past. The town's folk rejected her. All they saw was the drunk criminal. In today's Gospel, Jesus recognized that the people were hungry. HE gave them physical good but wanted to satisfy them with spiritual food. Bev was hungry too. It's too bad the folks in her hometown were unable to feed her. Thomas Craughwell of the National Catholic Register reviewed a book "How the Church Influenced (and still can) Western Civilization" authored by William Slattery. In his review he mentioned the exploits of Saint Boniface (c.680-754). He was a missionary who brought the

Catholic faith and culture to then barbarian Germany. He did something missionaries rarely did in the Dark Ages, <u>listen</u>. He would sit down with pagan priests and give them the opportunity to explain what they believed and why, then and only after they finished, he would point out the faults of their arguments and explain the beauty and truth of the Catholic faith. The simple act of listening can diffuse a tense situation, convert a doubter or just result in a more pleasant discussion of a problem. All of us can do a better job of listening. It worked for St. Boniface, why not give it a try!
