#### SCRIPTURE SESSIONS AT GOOD SHEPHERD CHURCH:

Fr. Connell A. McHugh will conduct Scripture sessions on the Resurrection Narratives for 5 consecutive Tuesdays from 9:00 – 10:30AM beginning September 14.th Father McHugh will offer an overview of the Resurrection Narratives and treat them in each of the 4 Gospels separately. He will discuss similarities and differences in the Resurrection Narratives, and treat the appearances and empty tomb stories in each Gospel. The main characters in the different Resurrection Narratives such as

Peter, the Beloved Disciple, Thomas, Mary Magdalene, etc. will be discussed and their reactions to the resurrection compared. Fr. McHugh will discuss the original ending of Mark 16:1-8 and the need to add verses 9-16 to the original ending in order that the Gospel not conclude on a negative note. He will also speak regarding how chapter 21 was added to John's Gospel as an appendix which does not really flow from chapter 20. The sessions are free of charge and open to all faiths. To
