ARE YOU A MEMBER OF IMMACULATE CONCEPTION So many times we receive requests for a PARISH??? sponsorship letter for being a Godparent or a sponsor for Confirmation, but we have no record of membership in the parish. Usually the request begins with, "I received all my sacraments at St. Ann's, St. Anthony's, St. Casimir's, or St. John's, so I just assumed I was a member." THIS IS NOT THE CASE. A member of our parish, eighteen years and older, must be registered under his/her own name not their parents' names. A member of our parish attends mass regularly and receives envelopes in his/her own name and contributes to our parish. If you have moved away from Freeland, you need to have joined a parish in your new location and be able to obtain a letter from your pastor that you are a member of your new parish if you want to be a sponsor for Baptism and/or Confirmation. On the reverse side of this paper is a registration form to join Immaculate Conception Parish. If you haven't officially joined the parish, now is a good time to do so while the paperwork is in your hands. Just fill out the form, bring it to the parish office or drop it in the collection basket at mass. A sponsor's primary responsibility is to ensure that the child they are sponsoring is brought up in the Catholic faith. How can you sponsor a child if you yourself do not practice your faith?
