During the month of November, instead of a weekly message, we will be telling our vocation story.

My Vocation Journey: My first memory of any type of vocation came when I was 5 years old. I was at the neighbor's house for dinner. After the meal we gathered in the living room and the whole family prayed the Rosary. I knew the Hail Mary, but had not experienced the Rosary. In grade school I became an altar server (living less than a block from church, my brother and I were

often called at the last minute to serve). I can also remember in 7th grade going to church with my class for the Exposition of the Blessed Sacrament. We were all directed to kneel. At one point Sr. Michael Mary's clicker went off signaling us to sit. I remained kneeling. These small memories were seeds of faith planted in me. Do you remember any seeds of your faith?
