A Message from Father Mike...



In the Gospel this weekend, the Sadducees challenge Jesus about Heaven. Sadducees do not believe in an afterlife. They make up a ridiculous story about seven brothers who died. Each one married the widow to carry on the name. "Whose wife will she be in heaven?" they said to Him. They didn't care about the answer, they just wanted to embarrass Jesus. They failed to truly listen to Jesus.

There is the lesson for us. We often engage in conversations with others and do not take the time to LISTEN. We are concerned about what we want to say in response and lose the other person's message. The challenge for us is to: First - Be PRESENT to the other person. Second – LISTEN to what they have to say.



As an additional message, I encourage all of us this month of November to pray for those of our family and friends who have gone before us marked with the sign of faith.
