Classes will resume on Sunday, December 5th.


A Message from Father Mike...



We begin the Advent Season this weekend. During these four weeks we will focus on the Advent Wreath and the meaning of each candle. This Sunday we will focus on the word **HOPE**.

This First Sunday of Advent is particularly important during the Advent Season, and many special activities are launched on this day. In the parish of Immaculate

Conception, we will celebrate Advent by Candlelight, and at Good Shepherd, we will celebrate a Contemporary Liturgy each Sunday evening at 6:00 PM. Advent calendars may be given out (each of our Faith Formation students received one of these calendars). These calendars count the days to Christmas. Usually, these calendars feature a design where each day can be opened after that day has passed revealing a message for the day. This makes it fun for the children to observe the Advent Season. And so the focus of the First Sunday of Advent is: HOPE because the children provide HOPE for the future.
