# An Advent Message from Father Mike...



This is the Third Sunday of Advent. It is traditionally called Gaudete (Rejoice) Sunday. The celebrant usually wears a rose-colored vestment (not pink – LOL). The third candle of the Advent Wreath is lit – it too is rose-colored. The side banners on the altar areas proclaim the word: Celebration.

In this weekend's Gospel, Jesus tells the disciples of John the Baptist to look around and see the good that is being accomplished: the blind see, the deaf hear, the lame walk, and lepers are cured. The signs are there, YOU JUST HAVE TO SEE THEM. The large banners in church proclaim: This Will Be A Sign For YOU!

The challenge this week will be for you to recognize the SIGNS around you that the Lord is coming. Once you see them, the Celebration will begin. Recognize Jesus as already present, then have that wonderful celebration!

Please have your Giving Tree gifts on the altar steps or in the parish office by this Sunday, December 11th.


